LEARNING OBJECTIVES

The children will:

1. Learn to watch and copy a partner's movements.
2. Develop their observation skills.
3. Develop their small and large motor skills.

Materials

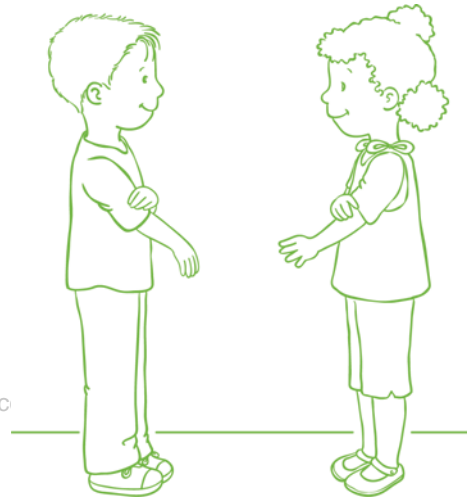
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VOCABULARY

cold mimic mirror partner
reflection season winter

WHAT TO DO

1. In the winter, talk with the children about how they have to stay inside so much because of the cold.
2. Ask the children if they have ever looked out a window wanting to go outside and seen their reflections in the glass.
3. Invite the children to take turns going up to a classroom window and looking at their reflections. Encourage them to move around to see how their reflections mirror their movements.
4. Tell the children they will pretend to be one another's mirror reflections.
5. Separate the children into pairs. Have the children face one another. Tell one child to move around, and the other child to mirror the first child's motions.
6. After a short while, invite the children to switch positions so the first becomes the mirror of the second.
